Long Island Mid-Suffolk Business Action (LIMBA) was established in 1968 by Paul Townsend, the former editor and founder of *Long Island Business News*. Today its Chairman is Ernie Fazio, who assumed the position in March 2002.

LIMBA, a not for profit action association that meets weekly for informative talks with form, focus and force, works closely with public officials on Mid-Suffolk improvement projects.

The organization has championed many improvements in infrastructure and provided a forum for discussion by respected individuals and institutions. Many leaders in government, business, education, science, environment and the arts have contributed and benefited from the organization's forums, and LIMBA is proud to help support their worthy agendas.

LIMBA programs are designed to address the needs of the region and appeal to a broad audience. The needs and problems facing Long Island change over time, but the need for inspired leadership remains constant.

Since its inception, LIMBA has been a catalyst for improving Long Island's transportation and economy by sponsoring weekly breakfasts that feature Long Island business activists and government officials, as well as by providing leadership in advancing new projects.

- ▷ Many other community improvements.

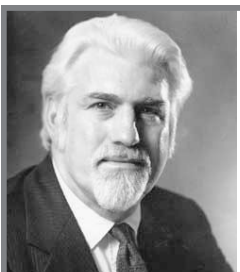

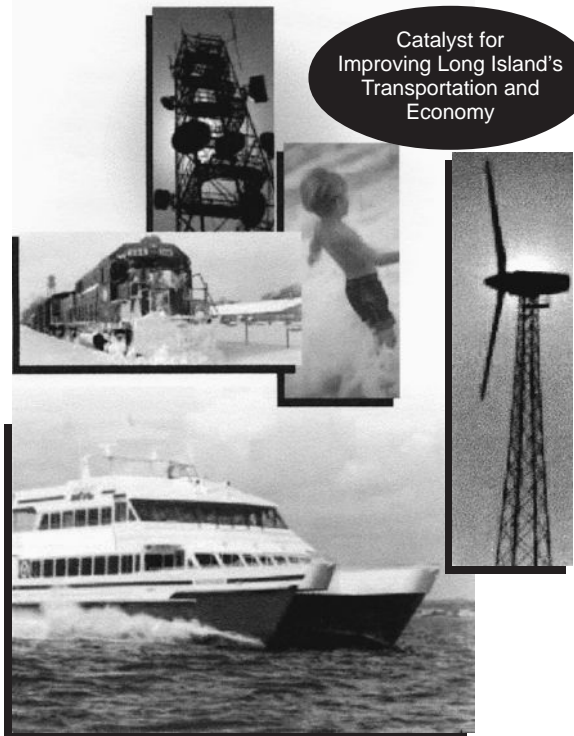


Paul Townsend
